

What's on at King St

BRISBANE CYCLING FESTIVAL



Can you hear the rhythmic beat of the cleats, clip-clopping around King St? Brisbane Cycling Festival is at King St for it's 3rd year and this year we are excited to have both start and finish lines for Tour de Brisbane at King St.

The festival will open with the launch of the Australian Red Cross's new fundraising initiative, the Human Race. This new initiative challenges participants to run, walk, swim, or cycle 26 km during the month of March. The Brisbane Cycling Festival is providing participants with the rare chance to complete their kilometers on a closed circuit in Bowen Hills on Friday evening from 3-5pm (right before King St Kick It Street Criterium). Join us in showing support for the Australian Red Cross and their commitment to the resilience and wellbeing of the 26 million people living in Australia.

We're keeping the festivities moving with the King St Kick It Criterium later in the evening, where those with a need for speed will be racing around a 900m course in Fortitude Valley and vying for that almighty podium finish. The streets will be pumping with music, lights, and fans cheering on their favourite racer.



ACTIVE LIFESTYLE EXPO

For those fitness enthusiasts who like to be up to date with the latest trends, the Active Lifestyle Expo will be running all weekend, Saturday 1 April: 9am-6pm and Sunday 2 April: 9am-4pm. This health and wellness event, located in Brisbane Showgrounds, will showcase industry-leading vendors and the newest products and trends in wellness, fitness, nutrition, cycling and more.

TOUR DE BRISBANE

The festival will close out with the huge Australian Unity Tour De Brisbane on Sunday. With the start and finish line on King St and over 110km of fully closed city streets, there will be rides of all different lengths and difficulties for all abilities to join in the fun and make a difference. This year the ride is looking to raise over 5,600 hours of medical research for organ transplant, heart disease, lung disease, dementia and mental health.

Exhibition Quarter is the exciting new residential development coming to the Brisbane Showgrounds Precinct.



Stay tuned for the full programme soon!






Parking offers on King St
