

Meet the build team

Mario Crismani, Construction Manager at Hutchies

It's hard to miss King St's newest building, so let's meet the people creating it! We caught up with Mario Crismani to talk about what he and Hutchies have been up to.

Can you tell me a bit about your history working for Hutchies, your role there and your time on King St with this new project?

I have worked at Hutchies for eight years now. The vast projects they undertake have given me the opportunity to deliver many buildings, none of which are ever the same, all providing their own unique design, and some easier than others to build.

Exhibition Quarter 1 started earlier this year after we met with Lendlease and the project brief was delivered. After many months of the team reviewing buildability, programming, and providing cost and project resourcing details, Lendlease awarded us the contract. To ensure the construction process is continuous, my role is always to look ahead, keep stakeholders up-to-date and maintain open communication.

I am very proud of the Hutchies team on this project because although we are all focused on the job at hand, we are equally focused on ensuring anyone involved in the project knows they can approach us about anything, knowing that we are here to resolve it.

Can you share with us any memorable moments or milestones that have stood out from this build so far?

Getting a building up and going is always a huge task. I think the milestone for me will be seeing the first level being poured and actually getting to see the building's impressive shape.

How do you think this new build will impact the precinct and community around it? Can you share any positive stories that have emerged from this build so far?

Although I rarely get to see a finished building full of people enjoying the facilities provided, I can see how it will add to the vibe of the entire precinct. It's a beautiful building with the ground floor set to light up the whole area.

What has been your favourite thing about working in the King St precinct?

Without singling out any offering, I am basically into everything in King St. If you see me walking past, feel free to invite me in for anything you need taste-tested. Always happy to help out!

Window to Culture

Magpie Goose Celebrates Indigenous Art and Tradition on Machinery Street

You may have noticed another captivating window joining the lineup on Machinery Street. This delightful and educational display is thanks to Magpie Goose, our local fashion store dedicated to celebrating Australia's First Peoples.

The window display showcases a print from their first fashion collections. This artwork is titled Flying Magpie Geese and was created by Kuninjku woman, Dora Diaguma. Dora first created this design at Bábbarra Designs in Maningrida back in 2003, and the design is still hand screen printed right there in the community. The artwork was proudly featured on Magpie Goose clothing in 2016, and even the Magpie Goose logo itself was inspired by this beautiful piece.

Murnubbarr (magpie geese) are a waterbird found in abundance in the wetland areas of the Northern Territory and Queensland and are known to fly long distances, particularly in the wet season. Murnubbarr are sustainably hunted and enjoyed as manme (bush food).

Sky High Studies



In a year-long project alongside two other schools in the nation, Fortitude Valley State Secondary College is taking their studies to the sky with the Thriving in Vertical Schools project in partnership with Queensland University of Technology (QUT).

Back in 2020, FVSSC was the first school to be opened in the inner city in 50 years, and the students and staff know how to make the most of their vertical surroundings. In conjunction with architects, researchers, manufacturers and educators, students in Year 8 have been studying how learning spaces can thrive in a vertical environment in our ever-growing urban population and shortage of urban land.






Parking offers on King St
