

# Among the Reeds: Honouring Stories of Place

A vibrant reflection of Brisbane Showgrounds' cultural landscape.

A striking new artwork, Among the Reeds, was unveiled on September 11 at the Brisbane Showground precinct. Created by contemporary Gudanji, Wakaja and Kalkadoon artist Ryhia Dank (Nardurna), the work reflects the deep cultural significance, layered history, and vibrant community spirit of Bowen Hills / Meanjin.

Drawing inspiration from the site's longstanding role as a gathering place, the artwork captures a story of movement, trade, care, and connection to Country. A gentle eel winds across the canvas, symbolising steadiness and presence, while a flowing tidal river grounds the scene. Bunya pine, wallabies, and native plants are woven throughout, representing abundance, life and the stories that have always lived here. The bunya pine and eel, chosen in consultation with Aunty Kathyrn Fisher, acknowledge the enduring cultural connections of this land.



The colour palette blends soft pastels with bright tones to evoke both the energy of community life and moments of reflection, and vibrant hues act as a reminder of Country's ongoing presence.

Ryhia's practice, which she calls 'storywork', draws on her Gudanji heritage and the stories passed down through generations. Raised in the Northern Territory, she honours tradition while embracing her layered identity.

Among the Reeds enriches the precinct, celebrating its history and connection to Country.

# What is your role on the team, and how long have you been part of the Exhibition Place project?

I've been working on Exhibition Place since June 2023. As an Assistant Development Project Manager, my role gives me a front-row seat to watch the transformation from concept to construction, seeing the building take form has been a highlight of my time on the project.

# What's your favourite part about coming to work each day?

My favourite part is walking past Exhibition Place and seeing it come together piece by piece. Every day, there's visible progress, and it's rewarding to know you're helping shape a place that so many people will one day call home.

# What's your go-to lunch order on King St?

You can't go past a Xin Chao banh mi, simple, fresh, and always reliable. But to wrap up the week, I'll often treat myself to a chicken-burger combo at Winghaus. It's the perfect Friday reward.



# If you could add one new business to King St, what would it be and why?

I'd love to see a dedicated sandwich shop join the mix. Supernice near Bowen Hills station is a weekend favourite of mine, and something similar on King St would be a hit with locals and workers alike.

#### What's been the biggest difference between Exhibition Place and other developments you've worked on?

The focus on common areas really stands out. From the gym and wellness spaces to the shared amenities and carefully chosen furniture, you can tell the team has prioritised creating spaces where residents will genuinely want to spend their time.

# How do you think Exhibition Place will influence future housing developments?

I think it's going to raise the bar for what residents expect. The level of detail and quality in the amenities will set a new standard for build-to-rent living. It's all about not just creating apartments, but a lifestyle.

# What's one new thing you've learned while working on Exhibition Place?

There's always something new to learn!

collaborating to problem solve; it's a fastpaced environment, but a really rewarding one.
