
From the cute and cuddly baby farmyard animals, to the majestic thoroughbred show horses, the Ekka is an animal-lovers paradise!

Suited to Success provides styling, clothing services & career support to people who are struggling to enter the workforce. They encourage referrals from a wide range of organisations including: employment service agencies, personal support services, rehabilitation services, disability employment service providers, & non-profit organisations.

At Shop for Her you can purchase high-end, repurposed outfits with all proceeds going directly back into Suited to Success to provide free styling & clothing services to people in need. Their opening week saw them raise enough money to help 11 people, & it's all thanks to you! Plus they update their range weekly so you'll always have a new opportunity to shop for a new outfit.





Suited to Success also works closely with other charities & community groups that specialise in assisting vulnerable members of our community including:

- > People who have experienced domestic violence
- > People at risk of poverty
- > People exiting correctional facilities
- > People living with a disability
- > People living with mental health conditions
- > Newly arrived migrants & refugees
- > People with housing issues

Revitalising one of our favourite laneways

Welcome to Bowen Hills is back and better than ever, hosting a calendar of events, food and sips to entertain diners. To support arts and culture in our community and the quirky space that is Welcome to Bowen Hills, we provided a \$2000 grant to rejuvenate the laneway famously associated with the venue. Local Brisbane artists were commissioned to create bright, colourful and artistic murals to highlight the precinct's connection to art and culture. Be sure to wander the laneway and check them out next time you are on King St!



School tackles food waste challenges

The next generation has truly taken the future into their hands at Fortitude Valley Secondary College with the help of a \$2000 grant from Lendlease. In a battle against evergrowing issues in food production and waste, the Circular Economy project saw students stepping in with innovative sustainability ideas. The project gave students first-hand experience in environmental and social sustainability issues, arming them with the knowledge to create a better planet.

King Street Precinct is lucky to have beautiful surroundings and numerous retailers and residents who will benefit from the collaboration with Fortitude Valley Secondary College. The project hopes to invigorate our local community to be mindful of food waste challenges and deliver even more opportunities for growth. We cannot wait to see what comes next for the project and students

Connecting bur community

Those who don't have access to housing can also be uncontactable, which is a major barrier to accessing care, services and employment. Lendlease's \$2000 grant to 3rd Space allowed them to buy 26 entry level smartphones for the vulnerable members of our community. We were also thrilled to hear that 3rd Space has also been approved for the Telstra top-up program allowing the team to provide 3 forty dollar top-ups a year for these community members facing hardship.

For those facing financial hardship, the 3rd Space Connect program allows rough sleepers to connect with each other, access support online, and work with other 3rd Space programs. With the help of Lendlease's grant, vulnerable individuals have more access to wellbeing and mental health services as well.

Make a Mug, Make a Friend

We all agree that meeting friends and neighbours over a coffee can forge the person-to-person connections that have often been missing of late. The creative minds at artisan, with the help of a \$2000 grant, recently took this idea a step further by encouraging locals to get together at Kuhl-Cher while making their own mugs!

Creating better places & helping those in need

Furniture from four of King St's display units were set to be returned when we saw a better opportunity to help families living and fighting Leukaemia. We were delighted to work with the wonderful Leukaemia Foundation to support two families who have children suffering from blood cancer and were also affected by the recent floods earlier this year.

The first family's Ballina home has been flooded twice this year while their son Josh was undergoing treatment in Brisbane. With mum Lisa unable to work while the family is in Brisbane, receiving our furniture donation will significantly relieve financial pressure.

The second family, who have relocated from Hervey Bay while their daughter undergoes treatment, also had significant flood damage to their home and lost their clothing, furniture and most of their home's flooring. The furniture donation will help alleviate some worry about repairing their home remotely.

We are humbled to hear that these donations help both families focus on their children's treatments while they remain in the Leukaemia Foundation Village in Brisbane.








Parking offers on King St
